7. PRESENTATION OF COMMITTEE REPORTS

7.1 Memo from a Member of the Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee

Re: Addition of Pickleball Courts to Kiwanis Park

Tennis Club adopted pickleball into its facility in 2018. Only room for two courts (allowance for eight players); not enough space to accommodate the 20+ people who signed up for the sport. Approached City staff in 2021 to request converting two thirds of the skatepark at Kiwanis Park into pickleball courts. Would like to level ground and install pickleball courts, see permanent posts, and possibly nets, installed, and perhaps keep area locked to avoid vandalism and set up a membership program. Weekly indoor pickleball drop-in programming is being offered through the City at the Collins Hall facility.

Reasoning: Pickleball is increasing in popularity and we are already struggling to accommodate the demand for playing space; the skatepark sees minimal use.

Concerns: Do not want to prematurely take away space from the skatepark, and the youth who use it, or install permanent courts (potentially \$20,000 cost) before we have evaluated usage for each; the skatepark at Kiwanis is dedicated in memoriam so there is hesitance to alter; do not want to privatize an area of a public park--not feasible or manageable.

Decision: will refer to staff to work out logistics and determine whether this project would come from Facilities' or Recreation's budget.
