- Assisted lifequarding during times of staff shortage in February/March
- Taught a Lifesaving Society Swim for Life instructors course in April, 2022 to three candidates
- Organized spring swimming lessons and registration

- Implemented the change from Red Cross to Lifesaving Society swimming lessons (due to Red Cross no longer supporting their swim program after December 31st, 2022)
- Cleaned and organized office space and storage

- Developed daily, weekly and monthly cleaning/maintenance schedules for lifeguards to complete

- Assessed and evaluated different recreation software. Selected Intelligenz software and have been implementing/training with them to integrate the software.

- Implemented new youth drop-in programs at the Collins Hall

- Working on new fall programs to offer at the Collins Hall in the fall and winter months
